Zaajqha 28 – Chivkeeb Tshooj 28

“Nqezug Ntawm Kev Txhum” “Wages of Sins”

Loo 6:23 has tas, “Nqezug ntawm kev txhum yog kev tuag.” Thaum Vaajntxwv Daviv tau ua txhum, txawm yog nwg tub leegtxim lawm los Vaajtswv tug cev lug Nataas tseem has rua David tas, “Tug TSWV tub zaam txim rua koj lawm. Koj yuav tsi tuag. Tabsis vim koj tau ua rua Vaajtswv cov yeebncuab muaj chaw txobthum lawm, yogle, koj tug tub yuavtsum tuag” (2 Xamuyees 12:13-14). Ntawm Yakhauj los nwg tau ua txhum lawm. Nwg txeeb Exaus lub meejmom ua tijlaug. Tomqaab ntawd nwg txeeb leej txiv lxaj tej koobmoob kws leej txiv npaaj yuav foom rua Exaus. Thaum Exaus paub tej nuav, nwg chim heev hab npaj sab yuav muab Yakhauj tua povtseg tomqaab leejtxiv tuag lawm (Chivkeeb 27:41). Yeej tseeb le Vaajlugkub has tas. “Nqezug ntawm kev txhum yog kev tuag.”

Vim le ntawd lxaj hab Lenpekas ob tug txhaj nrhav kev cawm Yakhauj kuas dlim ntawm tej teebmeem nuav. Nyeem kuas taagnrho Chivkeeb tshooj 28 uantej teb cov lug nug nuav.

Romans 6:23 says that “the wages of sin is death.” When King David sinned, even he had repented, the prophet Nathan said to him, “The Lord has taken away your sin. You are not going to die. But because by doing this you have made the enemies of the Lord show utter contempt, the son born to you will die” (2 Samuel 12:13-14). Jacob has sinned. He stole the birthright from his older brother Esau. Later, he stole the blessing that his father Isaac was about to bless his brother Esau. When Esau knew this, he was furious and planned to kill Jacob after their father Isaac passed away (Gen. 27:41). It is true as the Bible says that “the wages of sin is death.”

Because of this, Isaac and Rebekah developed a plan to save Jacob from this ordeal. Read the whole chapter of Genesis 28, before answering these questions.

1. Lub tswvyim kws Yakhauj nam has rua Yakhauj yog has le caag? (Tshooj 27:42-45).

What was the plan that Jacob's mother gave him? (Read 27:42-25).

2. Lub tswvyim kws Yakhauj txiv lxaj muab rua Yakhauj yog le caag? (28:1-5).

What was the plan that Jacob's father Isaac gave him? (Gen. 28:1-5).

3. Moob pheed has txug "kwvtij" hab "neejtsaa" xwb. Thaum twg muaj teebmeem tes tsi yog kwvtij paab tes yog neejtsaa paab xwb. Ntawm koj lub neej, ib yaam tseemceeb kws kwvtij lossis neejtsaa tau paab koj lawm yog dlaabtsi?

The Hmong often speak about "relatives in your father's side," and "relatives in your mother's side." When something bad happened, we used to ask these two groups of relatives to help us. What was the one event in your life that you have asked these relatives to help you?

4. Thaum yug lug ntseeg Vaajtswv lawm es yug tej kwvtij lossis neejtsaa tseem tsi tau lug ntseeg mas qhov kws thov puab paab yug kuj tsi yoojyim. Vim le ntawd

cov ntseeg Vaajtswv txhaj yuavtsum sis paab le tej kwvtij hab neejtsaa. Txij thaum koj lug ntseeg Vaajtswv lawm, qhov kws koj tau taj cov ntseeg paab koj yog dlaabtsi?

Since we have become Christians but most of our relatives remain as non-believers, it is not easy to request their help any more. Because of that, the believers have to help one another as relatives. Since you became Christian, what have you asked the Christians to help?

5. Vaajtswv tau coglug rua Anplahaas, rua Ixaj, hab zag nuav tau coglug rua Yakhauj has tas Nwg yuav muab lub tebchaws Kana-aas ua puab hab puab cov xeebntxwv tug moog le (nqai 10-15). Vim le ntawd Yakhauj tau ua dlaabtsi hab tau coglug le caag rua Vaajtswv? (Nqai 16-22).

God has promised to Abraham, to Isaac, and now to Jacob that He would give the land of Canaan as inheritance for them and their descendants (Verses 10-15). Because of this promise, what did Jacob do and what kind of promise did he make to God? (Verses 16-22).

7. Nyob huv Chivkeeb 14:21 peb pum tas Anplahaas muab ib feem kaum rua Mekhixades. Zag nuav peb pum tas Yakhauj coglug yuav muab ib feem kaum rua Vaajtswv (Nqai 22). Koj pum tas ob tug muab ib feem kaum lug ntawm qhov kws raug yuam lossis ob tug muab lug ntawm kev zoo sab? Hab koj xaav tas koj yoog tau tug qauv nuav le caag lawm?

In Genesis 14:21, we saw that Abraham gave a tenth to Melchizedek. Now we saw that Jacob promised to give a tenth to God (verse 22). Were they forced to give the tithe or were they willing to give? And how have you learned to follow this principle?

Vaajtsim tuabneeg zoo. Tabsis tomqaab poob kev txhum lawm, tuabneeg muaj lub peevxwm moog ua phem. Thawj yaam kev phem yog chiv huv lub cuab lub yig tuaj hab yog Adaas ob tug tub sis tua (Chivkeeb 4). Txij thaum ntawd lug, tej kwvtij kws sib humxeeb heev tes muaj tsawg. Feem ntau tes tej kwvtij yeej sis txeeb namtxiv txuj kev hlub; sis txeeb khoom; sis txeeb noj; sis txeeb tsoogtsho; hab sis txeeb koobmoov ntawm namtxiv.

Txawm yog tej kwvtij ib tug ua txhum rua ib tug los yeej yog kev txhum; txawm ua txhum rua lwm tug los yog kev txhum. Tug kws tau ua txhum lawm, yuavtsum tau them tug nqe, hab nqezug ntawm kev txhum yog kev tuag. Yug tuag theej yug tej kev txhum lossis yug leeg rua Tswv Yexus es ca Nwg them yug tej kev txhum (1 Yauhaas 1:8-9).
