Zaajqha 8 – Chivkeeb Tshooj 11

Pejthuum Npanpees: Ua Yaam Tsi Hum Vaajtswv Sab The Tower of Babel: Doing What is Displeasing to God

Peb Moob pheej has tas “Xyeej tsawg tsi xyeej coob.” Moob ib txwm nrug Suav sis tua, hab zag twg los Moob swb. Lawv le keebkwm has, Moob swb vim yog Moob tsawg. Ntshe yog vim le ntawd Moob txhaj ntshaw kuas muaj kwvtij coob. Ua yaam twg los sis paab pisloo. Thaus tuabneeg nyob coob uake lawm kuj tsimnyog suavdlawg tsim tej yaam tseemceeb ca, ua puavpheej, ua chaw ncu.

Chivkeeb tshooj 11:1-9, has txug thaus tuabneeg sis sau lug nyob uake rua ib thaaj chaw hu ua Sinaj, hab koomteg puab ib tug pejthuum hu ua Pejthuum Npanpees. Tabsis Vaajtswv tsi pum zoo, Nwg txhaj ua rua tuabneeg nyag has nyag lug hab tawg moog thoob nplajteb. Nyeem kuas taag Chivkeeb 11:1-9, uantej teb cov lug nuav.

Genesis 11:1-9, records an event when people gathered in a place called Shinar and they began building a tower known as the Tower of Babel. But God was not pleased with their action. He came down and confused their language making them scattered all over the face of the earth. Read Genesis 11:1-9, before answering these questions.

1. Cov tuabneeg ntawd ntshaw dlaabtsi hab puab ua dlaabtsi? (Nqai 1-4).

What was the motive of the people and what did they do? (Vs. 1-4).

2. Vaajtswv pum tuabneeg kev koomteg hab lub peevxwm zoo le caag? (Nqai 5-6).

How did God perceive humans’ unity and ability? (Vs. 5-6).

3. Vaajtswv ua le caag txhaj cheem tau tuabneeg tsi ua tug Pejthuum Npanpees ntxiv lawm? (Nqai 7-9).

What did God do to stop the people from building of the Tower of Babel? (Vs. 7-9).

4. Nyeem Chivkeeb 1:28 hab muab pev rua Chivkeeb 11:1-4. Koj totaub tas tuabneeg dlej sab cuamtshuum Vaajtswv dlej sab le caag?

Read Genesis 1:28 and compare it with Genesis 11:1-4. What conflict do you see between the will of men and the will of God?

5. Nyeem 1 Kaulithaus 10:31, hab muab pev rua Chivkeeb 11:1-4. Koj pum tas cov tuabneeg kws puab pejthuum ntawd ua tsi yog qhovtwg?

Read 1 Corinthians 10:31, and compare it with Genesis 11:1-4. What did the people do wrong when they built the tower?

6. Xaav saib, ntawm koj lub neej yaam twg yog yaam kws cuamtshuum Vaajtswv dlej sab, lossis yog ua tav nuav yuav ua rua koj tau ntsejmuag xwb, tsi yog ua

rua Vajtswv tau ntsejmuag. Muab sau rua ntawm nuav hab xaav seb puas zoo muab thaam qha koj cov phoojywg kws nyob koj paab *Care Group*.

Chivkeeb tshooj 11 qha peb txug peb (3) yaam tseemceeb le nuav:

Yaam ib, tuabneeg sis koomteg ua yaam twg mas yuavtsum ua tav xwb.
Yaam ob, thaus twg tuabneeg dlej sab cuamtshuam Vaajtswv dlej sab mas tuabneeg yog tug swb.
Yaam peb, yog yug ua dlaabtsi los ua kuas yug tau ntsejmuag xwb mas Vaajtswv tsi nyam. Tej zag Vaajtswv yuav rhuav yaam ntawd.
